3. a) Account for Yahweh's demand that the Israelites destroy the Canaanites as they settle in their land.
b) What should Christians do when they settle among non-believers?
4. To what extent was the call of Samuel a response to public outcry in Israel's desire for a king?
5. a) Examine ways in which King David satisfied Israel's desire for a king.
b) What lessons do Christian leaders today learn from King David?
6. a) Discuss the factors that led to the death of King Ahab.
b) What lessons can political leaders in Uganda today learn from King Ahab's death?
7. a) Justify prophet Amos' condemnation of the people of Israel during his time.
b) Give lessons that Christians today can learn from the condemnation of Israel by Amos.
8. a) Examine the ways in which Hosea portrayed God's love for Israel despite their unfaithfulness.
b) Explain the relevance of Hosea's prophecy to Christians in Uganda today.
9. a) Comment on the message that Isaiah had in the song of the Vineyard. (Isaiah 5)
b) Explain the significance of Isaiah's song to Christians in Uganda today.
10. a) Account for Jeremiah's hostility to the worshippers in the Jerusalem Temple.
b) What is the relevance of Jeremiah's hostility to Christians in Uganda today?
11. a) Analyze the challenges which Ezekiel encountered in his prophetic ministry.
b) Give lessons that modern Christians can learn from the response of Ezekiel to these challenges.
12. a) Discuss the circumstances that led to the composition of Psalm 137.
b) Give lessons that Christians can learn from Psalm 137.

12. a) Discuss the teachings of James on trials and endurance in times of difficulty.

5. a) Account for the increasing rate of joblessness in Uganda today.
b) As a Christian, how would you advise people in your society to honestly earn a living?
6. a) To what extent have the medical workers observed the professional code of conduct in Uganda today?

7. a) Discuss the causes of drug addiction in modern society.
